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This cemetery is located on West Bangs Avenue adjacent to the Chesed Shel Ames Hebrew Cemetery; separated by a chain link fence. To reach the Schlossbach property one must go to the back end of the Chesed Shel Cemetery where there is an opening in the fence. This area is overgrown with bushes, trees and brambles. Some of the tomb stones are broken and lying face down and could not be transcribed. This family plot is approximately 25 ft by 50 ft. Only English wording was transcribed. Most stones had additional Hebrew writings on them.

Abraham Schlossbach, in his Will of 1929, directed transfer of this property to the Cong. Agudath Achim of Bradley Beach. This cemetery was situated along Springwood Avenue, Neptune, NJ. Springwood Avenue appears to have been the earlier Sand Hills Road. Sometime before 1930 this roadway was relocated and eventually was renamed West Bangs Avenue.

Harry R. Schlossbach, his son, as successor trustee conveyed cemetery to Cong. Bros. Of Israel in 1966.

The transcribing of all tomb stone data was completed on April 12, 2000 under the auspices of the Monmouth County Historical Association, 70 Court Street, Freehold, New Jersey.
